

Australia's policy of self-reliance gives priority to the ability to be able to defend ourselves with our own resources. In keeping with this policy, the Australian Defence Force is firmly committed to establishing a strong defensive posture in the north of our country.

The emphasis on northern deployment is evident through the retention of the Rapid Deployment Force in

Townsville and the basing of a brigade in Darwin, to command cavalry, armoured, mechanised infantry, engineer, aviation and logistics units.

The demand for tactical mobility in all seasons across the vast northern region is very high and Army's 6x6 Modular Vehicles are designed to play a support role in providing greater mobility for forces and equipment engaged in the defence of Australia.

The Modular Vehicle Variants

The modular variants are a 4 bed Ambulance, a General Maintenance (workshop) Vehicle (GMV) and an Electronic repair Vehicle (ERV) which were introduced into service with the Australian Army during the period 1990 to 1992. The vehicles roles are:

Ambulance The vehicle carries four patients on stretchers or eight seated casualties.

GMV The vehicle carries out field maintenance and repair of vehicles, weapons, aircraft, electrical equipment and welding. It also provides an 'Auto Club' roadside repair service during convoy movements.

ERV This vehicle provides an environmentally controlled facility for field maintenance and repair of electronic equipment.

With a crew of three, plus their relevant payloads each vehicle weighs 5600 kg. They have an on road range of over 600 km and a maximum speed of 95 kph. The vehicles have a separate cab and body structure with stowage facilities for medical, workshop and electronic repair equipment. The cab has three seats for the crew members. The vehicles are deployed in all regions of Australia and are part of the range of six wheel drive Land Rover variants operated by the Australian Army, the other being a long range patrol vehicle, air defence variant and general cargo vehicle.

The vehicles are easily loaded and transported in the C130 Hercules aircraft, which, coupled with the inherent high mobility and reliability of the vehicle itself, provides the Australian Army with an excellent support capability in the field.
